Kórnik – located approximately 25 km south-east of the city of Poznań is one of the major tourist attractions of the Wielkopolska (Greater Poland) region.

The town notable sites include:

- Kórnik Castle, built in the 14th century, rebuilt in the 18th century in neogothic style.
- Kórnik Library, one of the most famous Polish libraries, founded in 1828. Currently the library, despite being looted by the German Nazis during the 2nd World War, is one of the largest libraries in Poland and contains roughly 400.000 volumes.
- Arboretum next to the castle.

Distinguished residents: Wisława Szymborska Nobel prize-winning poet, born in Prowent in 1923.

Rogalin – situated on the Warta river, 19 km of the city of Poznań.
Rogalin is famous for its 18th century baroque palace of the Raczyński family and for Raczyński Art Gallery housing a permanent exhibition of Polish and international paintings.
Rogalin is also known for 1000-year-old oak trees (Dęby Rogalińskie).
Surrounding area forms a protected area known as Rogalin Landscape Park.
